CARE INSTRUCTIONS

GENERAL PRINCIPLES

- *Always use mild, non-aggressive cleaning products*
- *Always test before applying any treatment*
- *Dry surfaces immediately after cleaning*
- *Avoid moisture, heat, and friction where possible*
- *When in doubt, use less intervention, not more*

FABRICS & TEXTILES

Like all upholstery textiles, the fabrics used in this furniture respond to their environment and to everyday use. Depending on the nature of the fibers, they may be sensitive to light, heat, friction, and dust accumulation. Moderate exposure and regular care will help preserve their appearance and aesthetic qualities over time.

GENERAL CARE

- *Vacuum regularly with a soft brush*
- *Use a lint roller or soft brush for dust*
- *Rotate cushions to ensure even wear*

CLEANING

- *Professional cleaning recommended*
- *Spot clean only when necessary, using mild, non-aggressive solutions*
- *Always test on an inconspicuous area first*

AVOID

- *Machine washing*
- *Bleach, alcohol, or harsh detergents*
- *Excess moisture or soaking*
- *Heat drying*

NOTES

- *Natural variations and wear over time are expected and part of the material's character*

→ For specific fabric compositions, refer to the fabric manufacturer if needed

WOOD & WOOD VENEER

Wood is a living material that naturally exhibits variations in color, grain, and texture. It responds to environmental conditions such as light, humidity, and temperature, and may evolve subtly over time. These variations and changes are inherent to the material and contribute to its character and authenticity.

GENERAL CARE

- *Dust with a soft dry or slightly damp cloth*
- *Maintain stable indoor humidity*

MAINTENANCE

- *Wax occasionally if appropriate*
- *Repair small chips promptly*

AVOID

- *Excess moisture*
- *Abrasive cleaners*

NOTES

- *Wood is a living material and will evolve in tone and texture over time*

METALS

Metal surfaces and applied finishes may evolve over time as a result of air exposure, handling, and environmental conditions. Certain finishes are intentionally designed to develop a natural patina. Proper care supports this evolution while preserving the original aesthetic intent.

GENERAL CARE

- *Clean with a soft dry or slightly damp cloth*
- *Dry immediately after cleaning*
- *Always handle with care*

MAINTENANCE

- *Wax may be applied to protect certain finishes*

AVOID

- *Abrasive materials*
- *Metal cleaners or polishing (unless explicitly intended)*
- *Acidic or ammonia-based products*

NOTES

- *Many finishes are designed to develop a patina over time, this intentional*

STONE & MINERALS

Mineral materials such as natural stone and marble display inherent variations in color, veining, and texture. Their porosity makes them sensitive to certain liquids and everyday use. Preventive and appropriate care is essential to preserve their beauty over time.

GENERAL CARE

- Clean with a soft cloth and water or a pH-neutral cleaner
- Dry immediately

PROTECTION

- Use coasters and heat protection
- Seal when appropriate (e.g. marble)

AVOID

- Acidic or chemical cleaners
- Excess water
- Abrasive materials

NOTES

- Staining, veining, and small irregularities are inherent to natural stone

GLASS

Glass is a durable yet delicate material whose surface may be affected by impacts, scratches, or significant temperature changes. Gentle and regular cleaning helps maintain its clarity and surface quality.

GENERAL CARE

- Clean with a soft cloth and non-abrasive glass cleaner
- Apply cleaner to cloth, not directly to surface

AVOID

- Abrasive materials
- Harsh or ammonia-heavy cleaners
- Impact or pressure

NOTES

- Irregularities in texture or form are part of the manufacturing process

CERAMIC & PORCELAIN

Ceramics and porcelain may display natural irregularities resulting from their manufacturing process and glazes. Certain decorative or artisanal finishes are more sensitive to moisture and temperature variations. These characteristics contribute to the uniqueness of each piece.

GENERAL CARE

- *Dust regularly with a soft cloth*
- *Clean gently with minimal moisture*

AVOID

- *Abrasive cleaning*
- *Chemical products*
- *Excess water*

NOTES

- *Variations in glaze, tone, and texture are intentional and inherent to the process*

LACQUER & COMPOSITE SURFACES (CONCRETE & PLASTER)

Lacquered surfaces and decorative finishes require particular care to preserve their uniformity and original appearance. They may be sensitive to scratching, repeated friction, and certain cleaning products. Careful handling is recommended.

GENERAL CARE

- *Dust regularly*
- *Clean with minimal moisture only when necessary*

AVOID

- *Excess water*
- *Harsh or acidic cleaners*
- *Impact or pressure*

NOTES

- *Surface variation, micro-cracks, and tonal differences are inherent characteristics*

NOTES

The following recommendations are intended to ensure the safe, proper, and long-lasting use of our furniture and objects. Before use, we invite you to carefully read these instructions, as well as the assembly and care guidelines provided with each product.

Furniture must be placed on a flat and stable surface. Always ensure that the product is properly stabilized before use. Any movable, adjustable, or mechanical components — whether manual or motorized — should be handled with care and used only for their intended purpose.

It is recommended not to sit, stand, or apply excessive weight to parts not designed for such use (including armrests, backs, tabletops, extensions, footrests, etc.). Furniture should not be moved by pulling on movable or decorative elements.

In general, each piece should be used in accordance with its intended function, within an appropriate domestic environment, and handled carefully to avoid material damage or risk of injury.

Many pieces incorporate natural materials and hand-finished surfaces that may exhibit unique variations in color, texture, grain, veining, and finish. Such variations are inherent to the materials themselves and contribute to the individuality and authenticity of each piece.

Certain finishes—particularly metals, woods, and stone—may evolve over time, developing subtle changes in tone or patina as a result of handling, light exposure, humidity, and environmental conditions. This natural evolution is an anticipated characteristic of the material and should be regarded as a desirable aspect of the design rather than a flaw.

Changes resulting from normal wear, natural aging, oxidation, or patina development are excluded from warranty coverage and do not constitute defects in materials or craftsmanship.

Regular Upholstery Care (for COM fabrics, always check manufacturer guidelines for specific care instructions)

Vacuuming

Begin by gently vacuuming the upholstery to remove dust, crumbs, and debris. Use the appropriate attachment for the fabric type, paying special attention to seams and crevices.

Check the fabric

Different fabrics have specific cleaning requirements. Refer to the provided care and maintenance guide before applying any cleaning method.

Spot testing

Before using any cleaning solution, always test it on an inconspicuous area to ensure it does not affect the fabric's color or texture.

Selecting a cleaning agent

Use mild, fabric-appropriate cleaning products only. Avoid concentrated detergents, bleach, ammonia, or soaps designed for hard surfaces.

Stain treatment

Address stains promptly to prevent them from setting. Blot liquids, gently lift solid residues, and use warm or sparkling water for effective cleaning.

Rinsing and drying

Rinse thoroughly to remove any cleaning residues and allow the upholstery to air dry completely before use.

Protection and maintenance

Consider applying a fabric protector to help repel future stains. Regular vacuuming and immediate spot cleaning will help preserve the appearance and longevity of your upholstery.
